RULES OF THE FRANKTON COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

INCORPORATED

1. NAME

The name of the Association is "Frankton Community Association Incorporated".

2. OBJECTS

The Association is established with the object of maintaining and improving all amenities and creating new amenities at Frankton and to do all such things as are incidental to conductive to or necessary for the attainment of that object.

MEMBERS 3.

The membership shall consist of:

- full members being residents or landowners on the Frankton property; and
- associate members being persons nominated by (b) full member and approved by a majority of the Executive Committee; and
- any life member duly elected as a life member of (c) the Association at an Annual General Meeting of the Association.

ELIGIBILITY FOR MEMBERSHIP 4.

Any person shall be eligible for membership provided that that person has not been previously expelled from the Association and provided that he fulfils the criteria outlines in Clause 3.

5. CESSATION OF MEMBERSHIP

Resignation

Any member may resign from membership by giving to the Secretary notice in writing to that effect and every such notice shall unless cotherwise agreed to by the Executive Committee take effect at the expiration of one (1) calendar month after the giving of such notice but any such retirement shall not release the day of his retirment. Expulsion

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The Association may at any time by letter invite any member within a specified time to retire for DUN COIN breach by him of these Rules or for conduct which in the opinion of the Committee is prejudicial to the interests of the Association or for non-payment of subscriptions, and in default of voluntary retirement the Committee may submit the question of his expulsion to a general meeting to be held within three calendar months from the date of the letter requesting retirement and at such meeting the member whose expulsion is under consideration shall be allowed to offer an explanation verbally and/or in writing and if thereupon two-thirds (2/3) of the members present shall vote for his expulsion he shall forthwith without releasing him from any antecedent liability to the Association cease to be a member PROVIDED THAT voting at any such meeting shall be by ballot if so demanded by not less than twenty (20) members.

6. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

- (a) The Annual General Meeting shall be held between the 1st day of January and the last day of February in each year at a time and place fixed by the Committee, for the following purposes:
 - to receive the Annual Report of the Executive Committee;
 - (11) to receive a Balance Sheet and Statement of Account for the preceding financial year and an estimate of the receipts and expenditure of the ensuing year;
 - (11i) to elect members to the Committee for the ensuing year;
 - (1v) to appoint an Auditor for the ensuing year;
 - (v) to decide on any resolution which may be duly submitted to the meeting.
- (b) Not less than fourteen (14) clear days before the Annual General Meeting a notice thereof wishall be sent to every member at his last known address together with a copy of the balance sheet and statement of account for the year with a copy of the annual report of the executive committee.

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7. GENERAL MEETINGS

- (a) At least one General Meeting other than the Annual General Meeting shall be held in each year for the purposes of discussing general business.
- (b) The Committee may at any time call a General Meeting of their own motion and they shall do so within twenty-one (21) days of receiving a requisition in writing of any five (5) members stating the purposes for which the meeting is required.
- (c) Not less than seven (7) clear days before the General Meeting a notice thereof shall be sent to every member at his last known address together with a statement of the business to be conducted at that meeting.

8. PROCEDURE AT MEETINGS

- (a) At all General Meetings the President and in his absence any other duly elected Chairman shall take the chair and every member present shall be entitled on every motion to one vote exercised in person and in the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.
- (b) The mode of voting on all questions (other than elections) at all General Meetings shall be by voice or if the Chairman or any three (3) members shall require by a show of hands.
- (c) The mode of voting in all elections at the Annual General Meeting shall be by secret ballot for which purpose a returning officer and and resistants and scrutineers; shall be appointed at the meeting.

9. QUORUM

At all General Meetings, six (6) members shall constitute a quorum.

10. COMMITTEE

(a) The 'affairs and businesso of' the Association' shall be controlled and managed by an executive' Committee consisting of:

(i) a President, a Vice-President and three (3) to seven (7) Committee members, all whom are to be elected at an Annual General Meeting;

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(11) a Secretary and/or a Treasurer, both of whom are to be elected at an Annual General Meeting and who may at the discretion of the Committee be paid officers of the Association. One person may hold both positions.

The members of the Committee shall hold office (except in the case of death, resignation or expulsion for the Association) until the conclusion of the following Annual General Meeting.

11. MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE

- (a) The Committee shall meet at such times and places as shall from time to time be determined by the President and at all such meetings the Committee shall determine its own procedure.
- (b) The quorum for Committee meetings shall be one-half of all Committee members elected or appointed in a given year.
- (c) Notice in writing of every such meeting shall be given by the Secretary to each member of the Committee and shall be deemed to be duly given if properly posted not less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time appointed for the holding of the meeting in question PROVIDED THAT this requirement may be waived if written notice is given as above to each Committee member of a regular time and place meetings are to be held.

12. ABSENCE FROM MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE

Any member of the Committee who shall exempt himself without leave from three(3) consecutive meetings of the Committee shall ipso facto cease to be a member of the Committee.

13. VACANCIES ON COMMITTEE

The Committee shall have power to appoint a member of the Association to fill any casual vacancy on the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting and any Committee member so appointed shall retire at the next Annual General Meeting together with the rest of the Committee, but all or any of the retiring Committee shall be eligible for re-election.

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14. DUTIES OF COMMITTEE

It shall be the duty of the Committee generally to conduct the affairs of the Association, to collect all subscriptions and keep usual and proper Books of Account properly posted up and other records of the business of the Association, and to prepare and to submit to the Annual General Meeting an Annual Report, Balance Sheet and Statement of Accounts for the preceding year, and to ensure that the Association complies with all Acts, Regulations and By-Laws relating to the operation of the Association or of the Association's affairs.

15. COMMON SEAL

The Common Seal of the Association shall be that approved by the Committee, who shall be responsible for the safe custody and control thereof.

16. ATTESTATION OF DOCUMENTS

Whenever the common seal of the Association is required to be affixed to any deed, document, writing or other instrument, the seal shall be affixed thereto pursuant to a resolution of the Committee and in the presence of two Committee members (one of whom shall be the President or Secretary) who shall sign the document or instrument to which the seal is so affixed.

17. INVESTMENT OF FUNDS

The Committee may from time to time invest and re-invest in such securities and upon such terms as it shall think fit the whole or any part of the funds of the Association which shall not be required for the immediate business of the Association.

18. BORROWING POWERS

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The Assocation shall in addition to the other powers vested in it have the power to borrow or raise money from time to time by the issue of debentures, bonds, mortgages or any other security founded or based on all or any of the property and/or rights of the Association, or with out any such security and upon such terms as to priority and otherwise as shall seem fit to the Committee, who shall also be entitled to exercise such power to borrow or raise money.

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19. POOWERS OF THE COMMITTEE

Wanthout limiting the generality of the powers of the Committee to conduct the affairs of the Association the Committee may exercise all or any of the following poowers.

- to expel or suspend for any period any member of the Association inbreach of these Rules or whose behaviour in the opinion of the Committee may be prejudicial to the interests of the Association or who has failed to pay the Association's subscription.
- (bb) to expend any of the monies of the Association for any purpose in accordance with the objects of the Association including the power to pay an honorarium to any Secretary or Treasurer.
- (cc) to form such Sub-Committees as it thinks necessary.
- (dd) to co-opt any expertise that the Committee may from time to time consider necessary.

20. EXXPENDITURE

ANII expenditure of Association funds over the sum of TWWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY DOLLARS (\$250.00) shall unless anuthorised by a General Meeting be subject to prior approval of the Committee or a Sub-Committee thereof.
ANII cheques or withdrawal slips shall be signed by two meembers of the Executive Committee as defined in CTlause 10.

21. ANUDIT

The Association's Accounts shall be audited annually by an Auditor appointed for the purpose at the Annual General Meeting.

22. FEINANCIAL YEAR

The financial year of the Association shall commence on the 1st day of November in any year and cease on the 31st day of October in the following year.

23. SUBSCRIPTIONS

The annual subscriptions in each year shall be such assounts as may be determined at the Annual General Maeeting and shall be payable within (1) month of the Annual General Meeting at which it was leving.

24. ALTERATION OF RULES

- (a) These Rules may be altered, added to, rescinaded or otherwise amended by resolution passed by a three-fourths (3/4) majority of those present at a General Meeting of which fourteen (14) dayss' notice has been given, and confirmed at anotther General Meeting held not more than three (3)) calendar months nor less than fourteen (14) days thereafter by a simple majority of those present.
- (b) Every such notice shall set forth the purporat of the proposed alteration, addition, recissions or other amendment.
- (c) Duplicate copies of every such alteration, addition, recission or amendment shall forthwith be delivered to the Registrar of Incorporated Societies in accordance with thme requirements of the Incorporated Societies AAct 1908.

25. DISSOLUTION

The Associsation may be voluntarily wound up in accordance with Section 24 of the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

26. DISPOSITION OF SURPLUS ASSETS

In the event of the Association being wound up time surplus assets and funds after payment of the Association's liabilities and expenses of windings up shall be paid or distributed to the Queenstown-Lakes District Council Reserves Committee (or any such similar Local Body as may control the Frankton Community at the time of the winding up) for the express and sole purpose of improving and maintaining the amenities and reserves of Frankton area.

27. INTERPRETATION

(a) In these Rules words importing the singular shall include the plural, and the masculine gender the feminine or neuter or vice versa, and words importing persons shall include any corporate body including companies;

(b) If at any time an matter shall arise which not provided for in these Rules or in the interpretation of these Rules, the same shall determined where appropriate by the Committee whose decision shall be final.

The provision and effect of this clause shall not be removed from this document and shall be included into any documentation replacing this document."

The effect of amendments to rule 19(b) and the addition of 24(d) is to qualify for COMMERCE income tax exemption on interest and dividends received

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Rule 22 is to make the financial year of the association the same as the calendar year
